

Support given by specialist domestic abuse practitioners

- **65%** reported a cessation of abuse at case closure
- On average each client supported with 4 interventions
- Safety plans made with **95%** of clients
- Case workers report reduction in risk in 74% of cases (31% significantly)
- **77%** of clients felt somewhat or much safer
- 76% of clients reported that their quality of life had improved


